RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WEST MIAMI WAIVING COMPETITIVE BIDDING PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-74(A)(B), ARTICLE IV OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF WEST MIAMI AS AN EMERGENCY AS A RESULT OF THE CITY'S NEED TO REPLACE TWO (2) POLICE CRUISERS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURCHASE (2) POLICE CRUISERS THROUGH A LEASE PURCHASE PROGRAM THROUGH BANCORP MUNICIPAL LEASE PROGRAMS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO LEASE, PURCHASE AND FINANCE THESE TWO VEHICLES THROUGH THE BENEFITS OF PIGGY BACKING THROUGH THE FLORIDA SHERIFF'S PROGRAM FOR A PERIOD OF THREE (3) YEARS FOR A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$60,000.00) FOR BOTH CRUISERS, TO BE FUNDED EQUALLY BY POLICE IMPACT FEES AND EQUITABLE SHARING FUNDS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH SIGNAL TECH INC. FOR THE PURPOSE OF OUTFITTING SAID CRUISERS FOR USE AS POLICE VEHICLES; PROVIDING FOR TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR LEASE PURCHASE; PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, by memorandum dated May 27, 2015, the City of West Miami Police Chief, Nelson Andreu, attached herein, advised Administration that two vehicles presently used by the City Police Department as marked units have each approximately 102,000 miles and are due for replacement; and

WHEREAS, the total recommended mileage limit on police vehicles is 100,000; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that these patrol units be replaced immediately since the City of West Miami Police Department cannot afford to operate security within the City lacking two patrol cars; and

WHEREAS, the safety of the citizens of the City of West Miami greatly benefits by the constant patrol of police vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Bancorp Municipal Lease Program is used by Florida Sheriff's Program and generally offers savings and competitive financial safeguards.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WEST MIAMI THAT:

Section 1. The aforementioned statements are true and correct and adopted as is fully stated herein

Section 2. The City Commission finds that the purpose of two new vehicles to replace worn down patrol cars constituted an emergency for the City of West Miami.

Section 3. That piggy-backing from another agency will be advantageous for the City because of price, terms and conditions of a completely solicited contract from another public agency.

Section 4. The City Manager or his/her designee is hereby authorized to enter into a lease purchase program with Bancorp Municipal Lease Program.

Section 5. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into such lease program for two vehicles for a total amount not to exceed \$60,000.00 to be funded equally by police impact fees and equitable sharing funds.

Section 6. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Signal Tech, Inc. for the purpose of outfitting the two new vehicles for police patrol services.

Section 7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage by the City Commission and signature by the Mayor.
